We believe it is vital that Youth learn to minister to each other and to the community around them. This will allow them to see the church as something more than a place to go on Sunday.

This takes time, energy and people that care and see Christianity as an action word. In the last church we worked the community outreach programs made contact with over 200 new children.

MINISTRY EXPERIENCE

Faith Church

432 59th Street Downers Grove, IL 60516 630-968-1962 Director of Children's Ministries June 2011 – Present This is currently a part-time position.

We are responsible for all children's ministry from Nursery through sixth grade. I have explained some of what we have done while at Faith Church. We also are involved with all of Christian Education including Adult Bible Study. Prior to coming to Faith Church they did not have Adult Bible Fellowship on Sundays. Working with the Christian Education Team we have seen the start of Adult Bible Fellowship.

SPLAT:



Is a worship service geared for children. SPLAT is a multimedia high energy teaching, worship service. We use customized cartoons, puppets, Gospel Illusions, music that motivates children and youth. Youth are an interracial part of SPLAT (Children's Worship Service). The Kidz Krew and Youth do the Worship music, sound, lighting, videotaping,

puppets, drama, etc. The Youth learn to give back and to minister through this Children's Worship Service. Each Sunday has time of prayer time children learn the importance of asking God for help. When we started we had about 10 children and within a couple months grew to 29 children in attendance. Faith Church had a major church crisis and lost several families. Due to the church crisis the attendance went down to 8 children. We have since rebuilt to between 25 - 30 children.





CHECK IN SYSTEM

In order to provide more security we implemented a computerized check in system. Parents receive a label with a random number that corresponds to their child's name tag. The parent needs to show the label to pick up their child(ren). This system is both a security check and the attendance system.

KIDZ KREW:



Kidz Krew is open to fourth graders and older. This team leads music, the sound system, drama, puppets, videotaping, photography, etc. This gives children the opportunity to be involved in church and to have a feeling of being part of the church.

FAITH CHURCH cont.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

The community events/outreach at Faith Church made contact with 213 children that had never attended Faith Church. That comes to about 65 families that lived in the immediate community.



BREAKFAST WITH SANTA

This was a great outreach event to the community. This event was sent advertised via the public school system's email blast and the town's web calendar. We made first contact with over 80 children, the first year.



TRUNK OF TREATS

This was the first year that Faith Church has done a Trunk of Treats.

We made first contact with over 150 people in the local community. People came got candy, a hot dog and hot coco.





MOVIE NITE:

Movie night was right before Valentine's Day so parents would have time to go out for dinner. We plan on having several more Movie Nights at key dates in the future.

Faith Church continued

GROVE FEST



Helping Faith Church to connect with the community I worked with people in the church to get water bottles donated and a team to pass out free water at Grove Fest. We made several good connections and had the name of the church and their MOPS group in the community.



SMART CHOICE FOOD

We started a Smart Choice host site at Faith Church. Smart Choice is similar to the old Angel Food program that provides restaurant quality food at a major discount to families.

WEB SITE

In order to help Faith Church with connecting with the community, I started designing and performing the SEO (search engine Optimization) for the church.

SCRIP PROGRAM

In an effort to help Faith Church with their budget concerns we started a Scrip program. SCRIP is like gift cards people purchase "gift cards" for what they normally would buy during the week. The company, for example Target pays a percentage to the church.

SAFE SANCTUARY

I ran the Safe Sanctuary program for doing training and background checks on anyone working with minors.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

After School Program



The Learning League was started during my first year at F.U.M.C. We provided a large snack or small meal daily after school. Children arrived around 2:30pm and stayed until 6:00pm. This was primarily done with volunteers. The After School Program has been a major connection for F.U.M.C. to the community. We have seen families start attending church and becoming involved. The staff we have paid are from the church's Youth and another place we are teaching leadership and to give back to Jesus, the community and church.

SPLAT

SPLAT is a worship service geared for children. Each Sunday has time of prayer, we have seen 23 children accept Jesus as their Savior.

CRAM

Camp Reading And Math, we started this year to help meet the needs of families in the Hammond area. CRAM provided breakfast, lunch, and a good snack five days a week. In addition we provided two hours of academic work, one hour computer (academic) work, physical activities and daily chapel.

VBS

We directed three Vacation Bible Schools at F.U.M.C. The first one we directed ourselves, the next twoVBS's we recruited a Director for the church and people to staff the entire week. We remain involved to assist and to minister during the opening and closing times.

Activities

Back to School Party, Trunk of Treats, Christmas Wonderland, Easter Egg Hunt with Da Bunny, Mom and Dad's Nite out, Gross Olympics,

Backpack Of Love (BOL)

Through donations we provided 35 low income children with a backpack filled with all of their school supplies.

YOUTH MINISTRY

We believe that Youth should become actively involved in the church and its ministries. While youth need activities and services that are geared for their interest it is vital they learn to become leaders.

We design many activities and ministries so the Youth have opportunities to develop leadership skills.

Jr. High Ministries: After one year we had enough students being promoted from Children's Ministry

a need for a separate Jr. High Ministry was developed.

Activities: BattleCry in Detroit Michigan, Nite in a Box, Leadership Training, New Years

Eve Lock in concert, Super Bowl party. The Youth worked for four weekends and earned enough money to pay for the entire Youth group to go to camp for two

years.

Ministry:



The Youth were the main ministering force for the After School program and learned to observe people to see how we could best meet their needs and make connections with families.

The Youth were the main ministering force with most children's events and outreach.

The Youth were active in going to people's homes that had been thrown out due to foreclosures and moving the family's belongings to a safe location. They learned to judge people for where they are, but to help them and point them to Jesus.

FOOD MINISTRY

In order to meet people's needs we started the following food programs. We are at the point of providing one meal five days a week and three meals on Saturday and Sunday for about 40 children. Some of the programs are cooperatively run with the Northwest Indiana Food Bank and Second Harvest.

Angel Food Ministries: Can purchase about \$60 worth of food for \$30, Food Stamps are accepted. Angel Food has provided food for 40 to 100 families a month.

Food Pantry: People can come to F.U.M.C. to get groceries as needed. Assisting 7 to 8 families a week.

Backpack Food program: Gives 125 children breakfast, lunch, and dinner for Saturday and Sunday

Kids Café: Allows The Learning League to purchase food to provide more of a meal for children.





FUNDING

In order to continue the After School Ministry and Food Ministries it has become my responsibility to write for grants and to find funding for the programs. Currently seeking grants for operational costs, a church van, etc.

We have the After School Program licensed with the State of Indiana so we can accept Hoosier Child Care funding. This was a major project that is leading towards funding that will make the After School Program self supporting.

CHILDREN AND FAMILY COUNSELING

Provided counseling for children and families in the Hammond community. We counseled and assisted families that were in financial need, emotional and spiritual distress. We were able to assist families that were in crisis to get their lives into a controllable state.

We counseled with Children and Youth that were labeled at risk youth. These children and youth were involved in gangs and came from dysfunctional homes. We were able to bring several of them into the church and they started to attend and change their life style.






Children Ministry Team Leader

c. Started Kidz Krew

 - ii. Kidz Krew (5th and 6th graders) put on a child safety day with the Frankfort Police Department that was open to the community.
- 2. Trained 5th and 6th graders to minister through puppets, sound, lighting, video, etc.
- 3. Kidz Krew has quarterly activities that are chosen by the Kidz Krew members.
